Google is investing another \$1 billion in its Council Bluffs data center, bringing the total spent since 2007 to \$5.5 billion. The tech giant will also allocate \$1.3 million for water quality projects in the Missouri River Basin in southwest Iowa. Google's Joe Kava stated that their infrastructure enables them to "bring innovations to people locally and globally" through AI solutions on Google Cloud. The company is considering building a new data center worth \$576 million north of Cedar Rapids' Eastern Iowa Airport, but has yet to make an official announcement. Data centers like these are fortified warehouses housing computer servers and hardware that support online applications and stored data. Iowa hosts at least 26 data centers, with Google's Council Bluffs site being one of the largest. Meta, Apple, and Microsoft also have facilities in the state, with Meta considering another project in Davenport. Google aims to run its business on carbon-free energy by 2030 and has pledged to improve local watershed health. To achieve this, Google will provide a \$1.3 million grant for Missouri River Basin grade stabilization projects, collaborating with various organizations to "reduce surface runoff and erosion" and enhance aquatic habitats. The company's goal is to "replenish 120 percent of the water it consumes," but the specifics of their plan are unclear. Our Company
