There are two primary origins of the surname Collins, one stemming from Ireland and the other from England. The Irish variant, O'Colleain or MacColleain, is rooted in Gaelic and translates to 'darling' or 'young fighting man'. This prefix, 'Mac', signifies 'son of', while 'O' denotes 'descendent of'. Historically, the O'Colleains were a prominent clan in Co Limerick and played a significant role in the medieval Uí Fidgenti kingdom. In contrast, the English origin of Collins dates back to 1066, when the Normans invaded. This name is derived from Nicholas, meaning 'the victorious people', with the 'Col' sound being added to signify 'son'. The English Collins initially meant 'son of Nicholas'. Notable individuals with the surname include Michael Collins, a key figure in the 1916 Easter Rising and instrumental in negotiating Ireland's independence; Joan Collins, a renowned British actress with numerous film and television credits; and Phil Collins, a successful musician and singer-songwriter. Michael Collins, Irish revolutionary leader, champion boxer, and politician, is remembered for his role in Ireland's fight for independence. The Ó Coileain and Ó Cuillean both derive from Irish diminutive of cú or hound. Many notable person have bear this surname like Jerome Collins (1841-1881) founder of Clan na Gael early 19th century Arctic explorer. Eileen Collins (b. 1956) first female pilot and commander of space shuttle. Another American Collins is Susan Collins (b. 1952), the senior Senator from Maine, who is chairwoman of Senate Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. The Collins family has a rich history of producing notable individuals across various fields. Starting with Seán Ó Coileáin, an Irish language poet from the 18th century, who blended romanticism with Gaelic traditions and was admired by later Anglo-Irish writers. Moving on to Judy Collins, a renowned songstress from the 20th century, known for her association with iconic musicians like Bob Dylan and Joan Baez in New York's folk scene. Billy Collins, the celebrated poet, held positions as U.S. Poet Laureate and New York State Poet Laureate, and his work is featured in various subway cars across New York City. The Collins family also boasts Michael Collins, an Irish-born diplomat serving as Ambassador to the United States, while Tommy Collins is a filmmaker who directed Ireland's first bi-lingual feature film, "Kings." Meanwhile, several members of the Collins clan have made significant contributions to literature and art, including William Collins III, also known as Wilkie Collins, a prolific novelist and playwright. The name Michael Collins is particularly notable, with one contemporary author being shortlisted for the Booker Prize and another, the legendary leader of Fine Gael, who played a pivotal role in Ireland's struggle for independence before his untimely death. Throughout their achievements, the Collins family has consistently demonstrated a sense of grandeur and ambition, echoing their Irish heritage and leaving an indelible mark on various fields.
