When i drove back i found a shattered case i thought was my phone. Then I noticed my phone in the middle of the road. The case only had minor scratches on it snd my phone was unharmed. This case saved me from having to buy a new phone while 650 miles from home.I have tried many waterproof cases over the years, but always end up going back to LifeProof. However the color schemes for the iPhone 8 that LifeProof offers are terrible so I thought I would try Walmart's Blackweb this time. I can say hands down this is the best waterproof case I have ever owned. The case feels just as well made as the LifeProof at a fraction of the cost. The number one thing I hate about waterproof cases is how they muffle or block the sound. This case does not do that hardly at all, talking on the phone, and sound out of the bottom speakers sounds clear and loud. The engineers were smart in that they specifically left cutouts at the speaker locations with thin plastic that doesn't block the sound but still keeps the phone waterproof. Also the case doesn't add much bulk to the phone. It is definitely a slim design case. Another nice feature is the way the phone seals. There is no separate rubber o-ring that can come loose and be a pain to put back in the grooves like with a lifeproof case. Another plus is that the new iPhone SE that was just released is the exact same size as the iPhone 8 so this case will fit with the new iPhone SE. The biggest negative is simply that this case as of this writing is sold out everywhere. I want to buy another one but its been out for a while now. Walmart PLEASE BRING THIS CASE BACK!The Blackweb Waterproof Phone Case for iPhone 7/8 comes with detailed instructions, a wipe cloth, and a wrist lanyard. First thing was the water test. I followed the instructions (insert tissue into case [without the phone], place in bowl of water with cup or bowl full of water on top to keep case fully submerged, let sit for 5 minutes)...except for the 5 minutes part. I got distracted and it stayed under for 17 minutes. It passed. When opened, tissue and interior of case were completely dry. I then inserted my phone, sealed it back up, and tested all the controls. All work perfectly including mute and fingerprint recognition. Audio sounds good, plug at bottom opens and closes (manually) to provide full access to Lightning port. I don't have a lay-on charger so I cannot comment if that will work, but packaging says this case is compatible. We spend a lot of time outdoors rain or shine and enjoy fishing and canoeing. This case will provide piece of mind during inclement conditions and while enjoying water activities. I now plan on getting a Blackweb Waterproof case for my wife's iPhone 7plus, as well. My only concern would be heat buildup. The iPhone doesn't like heat above 95 and it' routinely 95 and above for weeks at a time where we live. But I ran into that issue with my previous, non-waterproof case and just had to give the phone breaks when it started feeling hot. I expect I'll have to do the same with this. But even so, I'm happy with this case and would recommend it.Great price compared to equivalent competitors product. There was a problem with the finish on the front edge where the plastic didn't flow properly into the mold. Also, the integral clear plastic screen makes it waterproof, but it easily scratches. That sickening crack still echoes in my nightmares. It was an expensive lesson, one that taught me the invaluable worth of a quality phone case. After extensive research and many purchases later, I've become something of an expert on phone protection, particularly when it comes to budget-friendly options that don't compromise on quality. Among these options, Blackweb phone cases have consistently caught my attention, offering that sweet spot between affordability and protection. So today, I'm sharing everything I've learned about these protective gems to help you make an informed decision before your next purchase. Let's start with the basics. If you're unfamiliar with the brand, Blackweb is Walmart's in-house electronics accessory brand that offers a wide range of products, including phone cases. When I first encountered them, I was skeptical—could a store brand really deliver quality protection? The answer, I discovered, was a resounding yes. Blackweb phone cases are designed to offer reliable protection for various smartphone models while maintaining a sleek profile. They're essentially your phone's bodyguard, designed to absorb impact, resist scratches, and in some models, even repel water. What sets them apart from many competitors is their ability to offer these features at a significantly lower price point. The value proposition of Blackweb cases is undeniable—they deliver surprisingly good protection without demanding a premium price tag. This makes them particularly appealing for budget-conscious consumers who still want to ensure their expensive devices remain protected. One of the first questions I had when considering a Blackweb case was whether they would fit my iPhone. Through my research and personal experience, I've found that Blackweb offers cases for many iPhone models, including newer ones like the iPhone 13 and 14 series. The fit is generally precise, with all the necessary cutouts for ports, speakers, and cameras. One thing I particularly appreciate is that they design their cases with enough precision that features like Face ID work flawlessly, and the case doesn't interfere with swipe gestures from the edges of the screen. However, it's worth noting that Blackweb might not immediately release cases for the absolute newest iPhone models right at launch. If you're an early adopter who must have a case on day one of a new iPhone release, you might need to look at other options initially before Blackweb catches up. For Samsung users, you'll be pleased to know that Blackweb hasn't forgotten about you. They offer a solid selection of cases for popular Samsung Galaxy models, including the S series and Note series. I've recommended Blackweb cases to several friends with Galaxy phones, and the feedback has been consistently positive regarding the fit. The cases wrap securely around the devices, with precise cutouts for the S Pen slot on Note models and proper alignment for the increasingly complex camera arrays on newer models. Beyond Samsung, Blackweb also produces cases for select other Android devices, though the selection isn't as comprehensive as for iPhones and Galaxy phones. If you have a less common Android device, it's worth checking specifically if Blackweb offers a compatible case before getting your hopes up. As Blackweb is Walmart's house brand, the most straightforward place to purchase these cases is, unsurprisingly, at Walmart. You can find them both in physical stores and on Walmart's website. I've noticed that the in-store selection can vary significantly depending on the size and location of the store, with larger supermarkets typically offering more options. Occasionally, you might also find Blackweb cases on third-party marketplaces like Amazon, though these are often being resold and might come with a markup. For the best prices and authentic products, purchasing directly from Walmart is generally the way to go. One of the most appealing aspects of Blackweb phone cases is their affordability. Based on my observations and purchases, most Blackweb cases range from \$10 to \$30, depending on the model and level of protection offered. The basic slim cases typically fall on the lower end of that spectrum, while the more robust, feature-rich options with additional protection, kickstands, or other special features tend to cost a bit more. Even at the higher end of their price range, Blackweb cases remain significantly more affordable than premium brands like OtterBox or Speck, which can easily run \$40-60 for comparable protection. Does this lower price point mean compromised quality? In my experience, not significantly. While they may not have some of the refinements or brand prestige of the premium options, the actual protective capabilities are surprisingly good for the price. I've dropped my phone in a Blackweb case multiple times (sometimes intentionally, in the name of testing—don't judge me), and it's emerged unscathed. A common question I receive is whether Blackweb cases are waterproof. The answer is a bit nuanced. Most standard Blackweb cases offer some degree of water resistance—meaning they can handle light rain or brief splashes—but they're not fully waterproof. Blackweb does offer some specific models designed for enhanced water protection, with sealed ports and additional gaskets. These provide much better protection against water, but I'd still be cautious about submerging your phone entirely or exposing it to water for extended periods. They're more "water-resistant" than truly "waterproof." If you're someone who frequently takes your phone near water—perhaps you're an avid beach-goer or have a tendency to drop phones in toilets (it happens to the best of us)—you might want to consider a specialized waterproof case from a brand that focuses specifically on that feature. When it comes to drop protection, Blackweb cases generally perform admirably. Most models feature a combination of hard outer shells and softer inner linings that work together to absorb and disperse impact energy. The corners of Blackweb cases—the most vulnerable points in any drop scenario—typically have reinforced bumpers with air-cushioning technology. I've found this design particularly effective at preventing damage from corner drops, which are statistically the most common type of phone accidents. Some of their more heavy-duty models also include raised lips around the screen and camera modules, providing additional protection for these vulnerable areas. In my drop tests (both intentional and, embarrassingly, unintentional), these features have proven quite effective at preventing damage. That said, no case is completely drop-proof, and exceptionally hard impacts or unlucky angles can still potentially damage your device. Consider Blackweb cases as offering very good, but not invincible, drop protection. The materials used in Blackweb cases vary depending on the specific model, but most incorporate some combination of polycarbonate (a rigid plastic) and TPU (thermoplastic polyurethane, a more flexible material). The polycarbonate components provide structural rigidity and help distribute impact forces, while the TPU elements offer shock absorption and a more comfortable grip. Higher-end Blackweb models sometimes incorporate additional materials like silicone for improved grip or specialized rubberized coatings for added durability. In my handling of various Blackweb cases, I've found the material quality to be quite good for the price point. They don't have the premium feel of some high-end cases, but they're far from feeling cheap or flimsy. Based on my long-term use and observations, Blackweb cases hold up reasonably well over time. The hard polycarbonate components maintain their shape and protective capabilities, though they can develop minor scratches with extended use (which I consider a good thing—better the case gets scratched than your phone!). The TPU components tend to yellow slightly over time, particularly on clear or light-colored cases. This is actually common across all brands using TPU, not just Blackweb, and is a result of exposure to UV light and oils from your hands. The buttons on Blackweb cases have, in my experience, remained responsive even after months of use, though they may require slightly more pressure than the naked phone buttons. Port cutouts remain properly aligned, and I haven't experienced any tearing or separation of different material components. Overall, you can expect a Blackweb case to last for the typical lifetime of a phone (2-3 years) without significant degradation in protective capabilities, though the aesthetics might show some wear over that time. Keeping your phone case clean isn't just about aesthetics—it's also about hygiene, considering how frequently we handle our phones. Fortunately, Blackweb cases are relatively easy to maintain. For routine cleaning, I've found that removing the case from your phone and wiping it down with a slightly damp cloth works well. For more thorough cleaning, a mild solution of dish soap and water applied with a soft toothbrush can help remove accumulated dirt, especially in textured areas or around cutouts. After washing, it's important to thoroughly dry the case before reattaching it to your phone. I typically let mine air-dry completely, which usually takes about an hour, though you can speed this up by patting it dry with a clean cloth. One caution: avoid using alcohol-based cleaners on TPU components, as these can potentially degrade the material over time. For disinfection purposes, I've found that UV sanitizers work well without risking damage to the case materials. While protection is paramount, let's not pretend that style doesn't matter—our phones are accessories we display all day, every day. Blackweb understands this and offers a reasonable variety of color options and designs. The color selection typically includes the standard options—black, clear, blue, red, and occasionally pink or purple. Some models also feature two-tone designs or patterns like carbon fiber textures. The clear cases allow you to showcase your phone's original design while still providing protection. The aesthetic of Blackweb cases tends toward the practical rather than the flashy. They don't typically offer cases with elaborate designs, glitter, or trendy patterns. Instead, they focus on clean, functional aesthetics that appeal to a broad audience. For those who like to personalize their cases, Blackweb cases can serve as a good base for customization. The clear cases, in particular, work well for inserting photos or decorative elements between the case and your phone. The harder shell models can also be decorated with stickers or decals without affecting the protective capabilities. Some users even paint or use permanent markers to customize their cases, though this requires preparation of the surface for proper adhesion. Officially, Blackweb doesn't offer custom printing or personalization services, so any customization would need to be a DIY project. If having a highly personalized case is a priority for you, there are other brands that specialize in this area, though typically at a higher price point. In our increasingly wireless world, compatibility with wireless charging is a must-have feature for many users. The good news is that most Blackweb cases are designed with wireless charging in mind. The standard slim and medium-protection models are generally thin enough to allow effective wireless charging without removing the case. I've tested several models with both standard Qi chargers and MagSafe chargers (for compatible iPhones), and they've worked without issue. However, the thicker, heavy-duty models can sometimes interfere with wireless charging efficiency. With these models, you might notice slower charging speeds or, in some cases, need to position your phone more precisely on the charging pad. It's a trade-off between maximum protection and convenience that you'll need to consider based on your priorities. Some Blackweb cases come with built-in screen protection, typically in the form of a plastic film that covers the display. In my testing, these built-in protectors offer basic scratch protection but don't provide the same level of impact resistance as separate tempered glass screen protectors. The built-in protectors can also sometimes affect touch sensitivity or create a slight gap between your finger and the screen that changes the feel of using your device. For this reason, I generally prefer Blackweb cases that simply have a raised lip around the screen for basic protection, paired with a separate high-quality screen protector. If you do opt for a model with a built-in screen protector, be aware that these plastic protectors tend to show scratches more readily than the screen itself would, so they may need replacement over time to maintain clarity. Some premium Blackweb models include additional functional features like kickstands, which allow you to prop up your phone in landscape orientation—perfect for watching videos or making video calls without holding your device. In my experience, the kickstands on Blackweb cases are reasonably sturdy, though not quite as robust as those on some specialized kickstand cases. They work well on hard, flat surfaces but can be a bit wobbly on soft or uneven surfaces. Other functional add-ons you might find in specific Blackweb models include card slots (for carrying an ID or credit card), lanyard attachment points, and grip enhancements. These features can add convenience but also tend to increase the bulk of the case, so consider whether the added functionality is worth the extra size and weight for your usage patterns. If maximum protection is your priority—perhaps you work in construction, have active children who borrow your phone, or are simply prone to dropping things—Blackweb's heavy-duty models are worth considering. These typically feature multi-layer construction with hard outer shells, shock-absorbing inner layers, and reinforced corners. Some include port covers to keep out dust and debris. The trade-off, as you might expect, is increased bulk and weight. From my testing and research, the Blackweb Rugged Armor series offers the best protection in their lineup, comparable to mid-tier cases from specialized protection brands but at a lower price point. At the other end of the spectrum, if you prefer minimal bulk and a phone that still feels sleek in your hand, Blackweb offers several slim case options. Their basic slim cases add minimal thickness to your device while still providing reasonable protection against everyday bumps and minor drops. These won't offer the same level of protection as the heavy-duty models, but they strike a good balance for normal daily use. I've found that the Blackweb Slim Fit series maintains a good hand-feel while still offering enough protection for my comfort level, though I'm generally careful with my devices. If you're looking for the sweet spot between protection, features, and price, I'd recommend looking at Blackweb's mid-range options. These typically offer very good drop protection, maintain compatibility with wireless charging, and don't add excessive bulk. The Blackweb Dual Layer series, in particular, represents excellent value, offering substantial protection at a price point that's often \$15-20 lower than comparable cases from premium brands. Installing a Blackweb case is generally straightforward, but doing it properly ensures maximum protection and prevents dust from getting trapped between the case and your phone. For most models, the process involves: Cleaning your phone thoroughly to remove any dust, lint, or fingerprints Starting by inserting one corner of your phone into the case Carefully working around the edges, pressing the phone into the case Checking that all cutouts align properly with ports and buttons Testing that buttons are responsive through the case For two-piece cases (typically the heavy-duty models), you'll usually need to place your phone in the inner soft layer first, then snap the outer hard shell over it. One tip from my experience: if you use a screen protector, install it before putting on your case. This ensures the case doesn't interfere with the screen protector's edges. A properly fitted case should have no gaps or loose areas. The edges should wrap securely around your phone, and there should be no movement or rattling of the phone within the case. All cutouts should precisely align with your phone's features—camera, flash, ports, and speakers. Misaligned cutouts can interfere with functionality and indicate that you might have the wrong model case. Button covers should allow you to press the underlying buttons with reasonable force—not so stiff that they're difficult to press, but not so loose that they trigger accidentally. If your case doesn't fit properly, don't try to force it. Double-check that you've purchased the correct model for your specific phone, as even slight variations between models can result in an improper fit. Blackweb typically offers a limited warranty on their phone cases, usually for one year from the date of purchase. This warranty generally covers manufacturing defects but not damage from normal wear and tear or accidental damage. In my research, I've found that Blackweb's warranty is fairly standard for the industry, though not as comprehensive as some premium brands that offer lifetime warranties or satisfaction guarantees. To make a warranty claim, you'll generally need to contact Walmart's customer service rather than Blackweb directly, since it's Walmart's house brand. Having your receipt or proof of purchase will make this process smoother. My personal experience with Blackweb's customer service (through Walmart) has been mixed. For straightforward issues like a clearly defective product, the return or exchange process is typically smooth, especially if you're within the standard return window. For more complex issues or warranty claims beyond the normal return period, the process can be more challenging, as you're dealing with Walmart's general customer service system rather than specialists focused on the Blackweb product line. I've found that in-store returns and exchanges are generally easier than trying to handle issues online or over the phone, so if you have a Walmart store nearby, that's often the path of least resistance for resolving any problems with your Blackweb case. I've personally used several Blackweb cases across different phone models over the years, and my experience has generally been positive, especially considering the price point. The most impressive test came when my phone in a mid-range Blackweb case fell from my pocket while I was cycling, landing on asphalt at about 15 mph. Despite the severity of the impact, my phone emerged completely unscathed—a testament to the case's protective capabilities. For everyday use, I've found that Blackweb cases hold up well to being constantly removed from and inserted into pockets, occasional drops onto carpeted floors or furniture, and the general wear and tear of daily life. The areas where I've noticed the most degradation over time are the color (fading or yellowing, particularly on lighter colors) and the texture (smooth areas becoming slightly tacky over time, especially in humid environments). How do Blackweb cases compare to premium brands costing two or three times as much? In my assessment, they deliver about 80-90% of the protection at 40-50% of the cost. The main advantages of premium brands like OtterBox, Speck, or LifeProof are slightly more refined designs, potentially more precise button feel, and often better long-term durability of materials. Some premium brands also offer more extensive warranties or better customer service. However, for basic protection against drops, scratches, and everyday hazards, Blackweb cases perform remarkably well relative to their price point. Unless you have very specific needs or are extraordinarily hard on your phones, the additional cost of premium brands may not be justified by the marginal increase in protection they offer. After extensive testing, research, and daily use, my conclusion is that Blackweb phone cases offer excellent value for most users. They provide a solid level of protection at a price point that's accessible to almost everyone. For the average user who wants good protection without breaking the bank, Blackweb cases are a smart choice. They're particularly well-suited for: Budget-conscious consumers Parents buying cases for teens or children People who like to change cases frequently Those who need basic protection for everyday use However, Blackweb cases might not be the ideal choice if: You need specialized extreme protection (e.g., for construction sites) You want the prestige of a premium brand You need highly specific features like waterproofing for deep submersion You require a lifetime warranty The bottom line is that Blackweb cases offer impressive protection at an affordable price point, making them one of the best values in the phone case market today. While they may lack some of the refinements of premium brands, their core functionality—keeping your expensive smartphone safe from everyday hazards—is delivered admirably well. So the next time you're in Walmart looking at phone accessories and spot the Blackweb display, don't dismiss it as "just a store brand." These cases deserve serious consideration, especially if you're looking to maximize protection while minimizing cost.
