Growing up, my family has always had dogs and, being dog breeders, we often had to do with a dog in heat. Sometimes, it seemed as if we were constantly dealing with a dog in heat and I often found myself asking me how often bulldogs go in heat? With the heats, most races follow the same rules, but the question is how often bulldogs go into heat. Generally, a female bulldog will reach sexual maturity between 6 and 9 months of age when you have its first heat. Once you do it, you should go into heat every six months, or twice the year. But did you know that not all bulldogs follow a program twice at the year or every six months for their thermal cycles? In fact, there is a wide range of thermal cycles in bulldogs and it is important to understand both your dog and its thermal cycles to determine how often it will go into heat. Furthermore, understanding the thermal cycle is a great way to determine whether the thermal cycle of the bulldog is normal or if there are worries you should discuss with your dog's veterinarian. Lick the vulva: once again, this usually starts before bleeding and continues for all heat. You will notice that your bulldog licks the vulva thicker a few days before it goes into heat. If you are a light bleeding, you can hide any signs of bleeding if it often cleans, so it's important to look for all the signs of heat in your dog. Urging more: as the swollen vulva, a few days before starting to see bleeding, you will notice that the urine bulldog is more frequently. Also, you will notice some marking behaviors in your female. Others will try to hide and be alone. You can notice that a usually calm dog is agitated, while a safe dog is suddenly very nervous. Temporary behavioral changes are completely normal and your bulldog should return to its normal temperament after the heat. Proestrus is when the dog starts bleeding first and is showing signs that she is always ready to be bred. With proestrus, you will see the signs we outlined above, with bleeding, vulva and swollen behavior changes. This heat cycle period lasts 7 to 10 days. Period of Two: Estrus During this time, the bleeding you are seeing will start to fade at a discharge of straw color and your bulldog will start to indicate that she is ready to reproduce. Estro is when ovulation occurs and when the bulldog can be bred. It lasts 5 to 13 days. Three period: Diestrus also known as Diestrus, this period is immediately after the occurrence of oestrus or after mating. During this time, the female dog, whether she has been bred or not, has hormones as if she is pregnant. This means that you can see the signs of a false pregnancy, even in the absence of breeding. These include nesting behaviors, where she can nurse a rag animal for the production of light milk. If fertilization has not occurred, the diestrus phase lasts between 60 and 90 days. If the bulldog is pregnant, the diestrus stage will last from 59 to 70 days and eventually when the puppies are delivered. The average period for a dog to become pregnant is 63 days from the first mating, also known as the first tie rod. Period of Four: Anestrus During this phase of the heat cycle, your dog will return to its usual self. This is the period of inactivity when your dog does not have changes in hormones or sexual desire. Anestrus is the period between oestrus cycles. On average, it lasts 2 or 3 months, however, it can last longer depending on the individual dog. And these are the stages of the heat cycle. But enough about stages, how do you handle a female in heat? My Bulldog's in heat, what now? Having a female bulldog in heat can feel like the worst of times, especially if you want a clean home. I also saw some dogs ovulate the day 25 of a heat cycle so it is always better to keep the female away from intact males for the 28 full days to avoid accidental puppies. Remember that while it is in heat, it can whine and do unwanted behaviors, however, it is important to have patience with her so that she remains happy. A If you are not going to breed your dog, you should consider sterilizing it to avoid future heats. Spaying Your Female Bulldog While many veterinarians still recommend sterilization before the bulldog has its first heat, new research on tumors and connecting early sterilization to long-term health problems have led many dog owners to wonder when sterilizing their dog. The answer will be different for everyone. If you are going to reproduce, then the laying of eggs will happen in the dogs years after, when it is finished having puppies.
