With time marching on, we center on the story of Sung Ki-hoon (Lee Jung-jae) and Hwang Jun-qi's (Park Bo-qum) journey to take down a corrupt organization. ###ARTICLEKi-hoons primary objective is to track down THE SALESMAN. Given Ki-hoon's limited knowledge of THE SALESMAN's syndicate, his approach seems unorthodox and possibly insufficient to succeed against such well-funded adversaries. Ki-hoon has undergone significant personal growth since participating in the games, displaying a darker side with his recent increase in bravery and willingness to confront danger head-on. Nevertheless, his past behavior shows he generally prioritizes self-preservation over putting himself at risk for others, which may make it challenging for him to fully commit to saving THE SALESMAN. The Ki-hoon introduced this season has become hardened by the games, with evident signs of PTSD, but his tendency to conserve energy and avoid risks remains prominent. His new-found resolve to confront THE SALESMAN might be considered sudden or even unnatural, as his character was initially portrayed as reluctant to take action without a solid plan. While engaging in the death games, Ki-hoon often attempted to convince fellow players to collaborate against their common adversaries, but he never demonstrated the willingness to put himself at risk for others. This characteristic is still present in this season's portrayal of him, where he is willing to confront THE SALESMAN, yet still focuses on securing his own interests. The loan sharks' pursuit of THE SALESMAN is hindered by their limited information and inaccurate references, but they ultimately benefit from THE SALESMAN's distinctive behavior during the ddakji games. Following these games, Mr. Kim and Wook-seok discover THE SALESMAN and tail him as he distributes buns and lottery tickets to homeless individuals. This approach seems unusual for a man who is supposed to be part of a well-financed syndicate, but it allows THE SALESMAN to gather valuable information about the homeless population. Upon analyzing their behavior, he determines that most people choose the lottery ticket over food, which provides him with crucial insights into his opponents' decision-making processes. Gong Yoos performance in this episode showcases his character's sadistic side and range as an actor. THE SALESMAN's reactions to losing are particularly noteworthy, revealing a level of enjoyment he derives from these situations. Meanwhile, Ki-hoon encounters Mr. Kim and Wook-seok while trying to track them down but is unsuccessful due to breaking traffic laws and being pulled over by Jun-ho, a former hero who was severely injured during the island games. The suspenseful world of Squid Game continues as Wook-seok emerges victorious, but at what cost? The Salesman's untimely demise serves as a shockwave, leaving Ki-hoon to ponder his next move. Gong Yoo's chilling performance as the villainous Salesman has set the tone for the rest of the series, and it's clear that he will stop at nothing to maintain his grip on power. Meanwhile, Ki-hoon finds himself facing another round of Russian roulette, this time with The Salesman's own life hanging in the balance. Will he be able to outsmart his opponents and claim victory, or will he succumb to the pressure? As the stakes rise, it becomes apparent that Jun-ho is hot on Ki-hoon's heels, setting the stage for a thrilling showdown between old enemies. With each passing episode, the tension builds, and it's impossible not to be drawn into the world of Squid Game.
