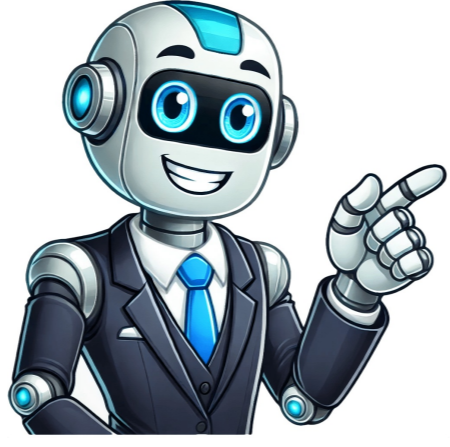

Basic numbers For larger numbers, it is acceptable to use either numerals or words depending on context (e.g. a thousand people/1,000 people), but you should always use numerals in technical writing, e.g. 200,000 km. For less precise larger numbers, the written form is better (e.g. several thousand).Money amounts are usually written as numerals, but can be written out when the amount is vague or rounded up — "it cost two or three dollars." The most important guidelines to keep in mind are: Currency symbols should be placed before the number, with no spaces. Example: She earned \$2,750 for that project. The symbol for "pound" is £. This is equivalent to the American symbol \$ for "dollar". There is no symbol for pence; when you write any coin amount it is written with a p after the number. For example, 20 pence is written 20p and pronounced 'twenty pce. There are 100 pence in one pound. Money can be written as, for example, £5.50, which means five pounds and fifty pence. The decimal point separates the pounds from the pence. The correct way to enter the British pound sterling symbol (£) on your computer depends on its operating system. On Windows PCs, there are several ways to insert the pound sterling symbol, but they only work in certain situations. In contrast, on the Mac there is only one way to do this—and it works every single time, in all applications. If your keyboard has a UK layout, the British pound symbol (£) is located on the number 3 key. To insert the pound sterling symbol on such a keyboard, simply press and hold Shift + 3. If your keyboard has a US layout, it won't have a dedicated key for the pound sterling symbol. To type it, hold down the Alt key, then press 0 + 1 + 6 + 3. (Type the numbers one after the other, without holding them down. For this key combination to work, you need to use the number pad with NumLock enabled.) If you're on a Windows laptop that doesn't have a number pad, you won't be able to use Alt codes. However, there is a workaround: Press Windows + R to open the Run dialog box, type "charmap" (without the quotes), and press Enter. Locate the pound sterling symbol (£) and then click the "Copy" button. You can now paste the symbol into any application. If you're in a Microsoft Office app, like Word, PowerPoint, or Excel, you can type the pound sterling symbol (£) by typing "00A3" (without the quotes), then pressing the Alt + X keys. To type the pound sterling symbol (£) on a Mac, press and hold the Alt + 3 keys on your keyboard. (This key combination will insert the pound sterling symbol into any application.) In Linux, every character has its own Unicode number. You can type it by holding Ctrl + Shift, then typing U followed by the Unicode number for the character in question. The Unicode number of the pound sterling symbol (£) is U00A3. So, to type the pound sterling symbol in Linux, hold Ctrl + Shift + U, then release and type in 0 + 0 + A + 3.
