To bypass Google account verification on multiple Android brands like Samsung, Xiaomi, Redmi, and more without passwords or Google account credentials, consider DroidKit's Android unlock tool. Verify your identity if asked and click Erase Data again. **Method 3: Using Google Find My Device** Google Find My Device allows you to reset or erase your locked Samsung phone. To use this method: 1. Sign into the Google Find My Device website with your Google credentials. 2. Click Factory reset device option on the left. 3. Input your Google account password to continue. 4. Proceed to click Erase in the Erase all data menu to confirm erasing your Samsung phone that's locked. **Precautions** Before performing a factory reset, ensure you have backed up your data using Samsung Cloud or Google Drive. Factory resetting your device will erase everything on it and restore it to its factory conditions. If you've forgotten your password/pin/pattern, be aware that this method may not work if you're signed out of your Samsung account or Google account. If you forget your PIN, pattern, or password on your Android phone, there are several options available to help you regain access. However, these methods have limitations and may not work in all situations. Smart Lock can automatically unlock your phone when connected to specific Wi-Fi networks, but it does not allow you to reset your security method or work after a phone restart. If you don't have a Samsung Galaxy device, your options are limited to remote erasing the device or performing a factory reset, which requires signing in with the same Google account. Unfortunately, using an older version of Android, such as Android 4.4 KitKat and older, can open you up to various security risks. The PIN or password is used as part of the key to decrypt data stored on an encrypted Android device, making it essential to reset the lock screen security remotely if you forget your code. For Samsung Galaxy owners, the SmartThings Find tool offers a convenient solution for unlocking and resetting the lock screen security remotely. However, this method requires having already signed in with your Samsung account on the device and having a Wi-Fi or mobile data connection.
