Dip it in pastel paint colors and dab it in a scoop shape to make ice cream. Add a paper cone underneath and finish with a pom pom "cherry" on top. This Tissue Paper Crab is bright and cheerful - the perfect summer friend! Cut out a big circle for the crab's body, then tear red tissue paper into little pieces and glue them on to fill in the circle. Add pipe cleaner legs and googly eyes for a fun 3D effect. Last but not least, there's Pineapple Painting - so sensory-friendly! Use a pom pom (held with a clothespin) to stamp yellow paint all over a pineapple shape drawn on paper. Then add a green leafy top with either paint or cut paper.
