## Masters golf money list

The Masters purse has increased significantly over the past few years and this year is no exception. The total purse for the 2025 Masters has reached a record-breaking \$21 million, surpassing last year's amount by \$1 million. The winner of the tournament, Rory McIlroy, will take home a massive \$4.2 million, while the runner-up, Justin Rose, will receive \$2.268 million.
