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However, it is not an easy reading for beginners and every time you read it, you will discover a few new lessons on writing. If you take this, read at least 2-3 times. I went through this book covers how to write for the web, which has its nuances. Books about talking I crossed the number of books on howwell English, and are woefully short on foundations and insights on most components to talk. They focus strongly onand shape phrases for common situations (such as healthy, as speaking on the phone, how to make a sales call, and so on.) some also focus on vocabulary and pronunciation. common situations can be covered in a book and how many can they remember? to add a layer, more often than not, you will not find a situation that takes place exactly the way you read in the book. a real conversation on any topic, say time, can go in millions of directions. in the same vein, pronunciation is difficult to learn through the phonetic form as mentioned in most books. much better is the non-phonic form. here is an example so that we can understand this. try to pronounce the following two: Source: phonetic form and non-phonic form if you are like most, you fight with the first (phonetic) because of its alien symbols. the second (non phonetic form – that the word in question is 'refrigerator'). better yet is listening to pronunciation. This is the way most of us have learned pronunciation — listening to others or directly to the pronunciation of words on google. on vocabulary that you can actually go into speech and keep it for a long time. can also talk about how people who stop a lot for the desire for good vocabulary (know the word in their native language, but not in English) can build their basic vocabulary fast. book can prescribe 1-2 (you don't need more) exercises you can practice anywhere, at any time to identify gaps in yourand consolidate existing vocabulary. And the mistakes to avoid? People spend months and years in futile looking for things that don't work. I know people who adopt watching moviesread newspapers as the main tools to get better to speak English. To sum up this part, a book about talking should explain tactics that people can use to learn by themselves. In other words, instead of selling one hundred types of fish to someone, he teaches them how to catch fish. They will get all the variety by themselves. Give people basics, insights (and not only lists) about how to learn different English spoken components. And how to avoid common mistakes. Before closing this section, I must emphasize that you get better to talk through more talk. A book can only support. At the fundamental level, speaking requires your vocal organs (slide, tongue and throat) to get used to producing sounds in a certain rhythm (pause, intonation, but, as mentioned in the previous section, the pronunciation of learning from books is an inefficient way. The best way to learn pronunciation is to listen (and not read) pronunciation. But, unfortunately, books do not speak. dictionaries online, however, do. Listen to the pronunciation on online dictionaries online for pronunciation that I recommend to you are: Dictionary.com ( Provides pronunciation in non-phonic form, which is much more intuitive than the phonetic form.) Cambridge 6 English Dictionary. 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This method is much more sustainable and the network (keep your vocabulary for a long time) than going through the word lists. here you build vocabulary at a constant pace, learning through context (of the book you are reading.) said this, I looked at the following four vocabulary books to understand their effectiveness in the construction of vocabulary that you can use in speech and writing: word power made easy by norman lewis 30 days for more powerful vocabulary of wilfred funk and norman lewis all on words of maxwell nurnberg and morris rosenblum how to build a better vocabulary of personality, doctors, science, word habits and compliments, which is an ideal way to learn words and also have extensive exercises in each chapter to practice the vocabulary you are learning. However, I think that these books do not have a few points: learning how a word is used through examples pronunciation is mentioned in phonetic symbols, which is less intuitive than non-phonic form. (We have seen the example of the word 'refrigerator' before in the post.) Also, when it comes to pronunciation, all booksfrom the lack of option to hear pronunciation (for obvious reasons,) something that can be realized on an online dictionary through only the click of a button. They go too deep into unsolicited things such as the origin and dissection (prefix, root and suffix) of the word. Few are interested in exploring a word like that, and therefore this information distracts the reader and unnecessarily loads the chapters. The significant proportion of words in these books is rare and difficult and should be avoided in verbal or written communication. (Some people mistakenly believe that falling into difficult words in their speech and writing will make them look smart.)
