First-round financial aid determinations are typically made in mid-March. The Academy first opened its doors to just over 200 students in September 2001 at its new campus located in Plymouth, Minnesota (just northwest of Minneapolis) and houses the entire student body conveniently under one roof. Providence Academy is accredited by the Independent School Association of the Central States (ISACS) and is approved as a Catholic School affiliated with the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis, as well as by the State of Minnesota Department of Education. In addition, the Academy is a member of The College Admissions Counselors (NACAC), and the Minnesota Association of Independent Schools (MAIS). Our student community is a multi-talented group of nearly 950 diverse students coming from over 60 towns/cities in the Minneapolis/St. Paul metropolitan area, with a handful of students receive tuition assistance. Providence prefers to keep families together; however, admission is not automatic for siblings. All applicants, regardless of family connection, are evaluated according to the same criteria. All admissions decisions weigh the best interests of the individual child and the school. Yes. Lower School applicants (those entering Pre-K through 5th grade) must have one academic recommendation form from a current teacher (Pre-K and Kindergarten candidates with no prior school experience are exempt). Middle and Upper School applicants (those entering 6th grade and above) must have two academic recommendation forms from current teachers (one from a Mathematics teacher and one from an English teacher). Personal recommendations are not required but will be included as part of a student's application file if received. Please note that personally. Yes, depending on current year, optimal class sizes, and other situational circumstances. If we have reached optimal enrollment, we will place admissable students in a wait pool. The school relies on revenue sources such as annual giving to fully fund the financial aid, grants, and other sources of assistance that make attending Providence a reality for our families. Each year Providence Academy is encouraged to apply for financial assistance. Many factors are taken into account during the financial assistance application for Providence. The first consideration of allocated funds is given to renewal applicants (i.e. current students) who have completed all financial assistance application requirements by the deadline. Second consideration is given to current students. All new and renewal applicants who complete all financial assistance application requirements after the deadline are considered for any funds that remain or that may become available at a later date. Please note that funds are not guaranteed for families whose application requirements are received after the deadline. Providence utilizes a third party assessor, TADS (Tuition Aid Data Services), for all tuition assistance applications. Evaluations result in a variety of grants for families in varying amounts of tuition covered. These grants reflect the availability of funds in the greater pool of candidates as well as assessment of individual student/family financial need. Tuition assistance awards are determined by a very small, select committee that does not include Providence faculty. No one outside of that committee, aside from the Providence Academy Business Office, are aware of who receives assistance. No. Providence requires families receiving assistance to re-apply each year in order to be considered for allocations. Understanding that it is the family's obligation to ensure with the Business Office that all accounts are current, if a family is in arrears and has not made special arrangements with the business office, the Financial Aid Committee may not allocate aid for the following year.
