If you import or modify a vehicle, or if you have been ordered to have it re-tested after a roadworthiness test, the vehicle needs to be tested. Read more about how to change or cancel a vehicle test Before you book a session for a vehicle test, this is considered an application to have your vehicle approved. You are therefore responsible for providing accurate information about yourself and your vehicle. If you book a test on behalf of someone else, you need to be able to document that you are authorised to apply for approval of the vehicle on the owner's behalf when you book a test. There cannot be any active approval applications under processing for the vehicle you are booking a test for. Tests for first-time approval are only for vehicles that have not been previously approved in Norway. If you need to book a test for an imported vehicle, the vehicle must be cleared through customs before you book the test. Booking a vehicle test When you log in, you will find an overview of the various tests you can book, which Driver and Vehicle Licensing Offices offer what kinds of tests, and whether they have available test sessions. Log in to book a vehicle test We do not perform roadworthiness tests. If you are looking for a place to carry out periodic roadworthiness test, you can find an approved garage. The Norwegian Public Roads Administration does not carry out repairs, but checks and approves/adjusts information within these categories: First-time approval — the vehicle is not registered in Norway Alteration — approval of vehicle modifications, also including approval for Tempo 100 Correction — changes to technical information or status Administrative test— test of technical condition Extensive alterations Additional approval (e.g. in connection with horse transport, emergency vehicles, ADR, school vehicles or licensed passenger transport) Read more about applying for additional approval for licensed passenger transport and temporary exemption from the ordinary approval process. The price of a vehicle test varies depending on the type of test. You will be informed of the price of the test when you book the test session. You can pay for the vehicle test at the time of booking or within three business days to keep your booking. Log in to Your Page, go to "Vehicle test", and choose "Your vehicle test sessions". You can also pay for the vehicle test at a Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office. You need to book an appointment («vehicle registration») to pay at the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office. Book an appointment at a Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office Please remember to bring the required documentation for the vehicle test. The requirement for documentation varies for the different vehicle tests. You will be informed what kind of documentation you need to bring to the vehicle test when you book a test session. You can book several types of tests to be performed during the same visit, but be aware that different types of tests require different expertise from the Norwegian Public Roads Administration. Therefore, it can be difficult to find an available session if the session contains many different types of tests. You can have some tests performed at the same time for some combinations of towing vehicle and trailer. This requires that both vehicles need the same test, for example first-time approval or annual test of additional approval for ADR. The NPRA does not perform roadworthiness tests. However, a roadworthiness test (or a roadside inspection by the Norwegian Public Roads Administration, the police or Norwegian Customs), may reveal defects and deficiencies that require you to have the car tested by the Norwegian Public Roads Administration. For example, it could be that your vehicle has not been modified in accordance with the right specifications or that you have installed equipment on the vehicle that is not approved. Change or cancel a booking Change a booking You can change a test session booking up to 14:00 on the business day before the test. These are the changes that you can make: Change the time of the vehicle test – up to 3 times Change the place for the vehicle test (change Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office) – one time only Change what vehicle is to be tested – one time only Log in to change a vehicle test booking Cancellations and refunds You can also cancel a booked vehicle test. If you have already paid for the vehicle test you wish to cancel, you can request a refund. To get a refund, you must cancel no later than one business day, and at least 24 hours, before the time of the booked test. In order to receive a refund you need to send us a written request through our contact form (Norwegian only). In the field where you are asked to describe your enquiry, you should write that you wish to have the vehicle test fee refunded, along with your date of birth or organisation number (depending on whether you paid privately or as a company) and bank account number. If you paid online, please enclose a copy of the receipt you received under "Messages" and quote the reference number. If you paid at a Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office, please enclose a copy of the receipt you received when you paid there. Log in to cancel a vehicle test booking Fill in the contact form to get a refund (Norwegian only) Sometimes test sessions may be cancelled by us due to unforeseen circumstances at the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office. If this happens, you will receive an SMS explaining this and redirecting you to the facility where you can book a new session online. If you have already paid for the test, you do not need to do anything. The payment will apply also to your new booking. Consequences of misuse of the booking facility Misuse of the booking facility means deliberately making a booking where the time, place or vehicle is not a genuine part of the application for approval of the vehicle. For example, a booking is not considered genuine if the owner's consent has not been obtained before the booking is made. Another example is if you book test sessions at a Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office where you repeatedly fail to turn up. Consequences of misuse If you misuse the booking facility, the following may be the consequences: Restricted access to booking new vehicle testsA limit may be imposed as to how many test sessions you need per week, based on the average number of test sessions you have used per week. Blocked access to booking tests at a specific Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office (traffikkstasjon)A block may be imposed so that it is not possible to book a test at a specific Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office for a limited period of time Suspended access to the booking facilityIf you repeatedly misuse the booking facility, your access to booking vehicle tests may be suspended for a limited period of time. You take your driving test at a Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office (traffikkstasjon). You can either authorise your driving school to book a test session for you or you can book the test yourself. Before you can take the driving test you need to have completed all mandatory training before you can take the practical driving test. Your training must also be registered in our systems. In addition: The police must have approved your conduct history. You must have passed the theory test. You must have submitted a health certificate, if applicable. You can always check how far you have come in your training, whether we have received your health certificate, and whether your conduct history has been approved, on Your Page. Log in Your Page You take the driving test at a Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office (traffikkstasjon). The practical driving test varies depending on the category of the driving licence you are tested for. Taking the driving test with automatic transmission If you pass your driving test with automatic transmission, you will get a driving licence with a code showing that you may only drive vehicles with automatic transmission. If you later need to drive cars with manual transmission, you will have to take a new driving test with a manual transmission car. You can learn to drive with manual transmission privately, or take driving lessons. Taking the driving test with manual transmission If you pass your driving test with a manual transmission car, you will be able to drive cars with both transmission systems. Be well prepared when you take the test Your best move is to be well prepared so that you pass your driving test the first time you try. If you fail, waiting time will be longer for you as well as for other people wanting to take the test. How to pay for the test When you book a session for the practical driving test, you will be given a deadline for how late the session may be cancelled. Once the cancellation deadline has expired, you will receive an SMS saying that you can pay for the test on Your Page. You can also pay for the test when you come to the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office, but this will be more expensive. If you cancel your booking for a test later than the second-last business day before the test, you must pay for the test. Fees and information about payment at the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office When you take the practical driving test When you arrive to take your practical driving test, you will have to present valid proof of identity. You have to provide a vehicle for the test yourself. The vehicle you use for your practical driving test must be approved by the Norwegian Public Roads Administration and must be rented from a driving school. The test lasts up to 75 minutes and is divided into three parts The test lasts for 65 -75 minutes, depending on the category you are being tested in. The practical test is divided into three parts: Preparing the vehicle Safety check. You will be given a randomly selected question/task, for example on testing the brakes or refilling windscreen washer fluid. Driving. The drive itself is the most extensive part and it follows a predetermined route. Your examiner will provide you with directions as you go. You must drive and solve the tasks you are given without assistance. The test will, to the extent that this is possible, be assessed as a whole. It is you who are the driver, and who are responsible for what is done during the test. After the practical driving test As soon as the test is over, you will be told whether you passed or not, and you will be given a written statement explaining the decision made. When you have passed your driving test, you will receive an SMS saying whether you can order your driving licence on Your Page, or whether you need to order it at a Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office (traffikkstasjon). Your driving licence will be sent to you by post regardless of how the test is made. You can also collect it yourself at the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Office. You will receive a temporary driving permit once you have passed your driving test. This permit is valid in Norway only. Remember that it is illegal to drive without a valid driving licence or a temporary driving permit. If you failed your practical driving test, you need to wait for at least four weeks before you can try again. If you take the test for categories C, CE, D and DE, you must wait one week. You will be given a copy of the assessment form filled in by the examiner, either at the end of the test, or it may be mailed to you. It will then be sent to your digital postbox, or to Altinn. If you do not have a digital postbox, it will be sent by regular post to your address. The form provides information that you can use when preparing for a new test. You will have to pay for a new practical driving test.
