## How many versions of cinderella movies are there

In addition, several others have drawn inspiration from the classic tale in an attempt to spin the story in a slightly different direction, such as 1998's Ever After: A Cinderella Story. But just how many Cinderella movies are there? Cinderella (1911) In 1911, the story met with slightly more praise and reversed Florence La Badie as the leading lady. A few scenes were changed in this version of the story, but for the most part, it remained true to the 1957 version. In this storyline, the prince actually plays a large role in building a relationship with this fiery and temperamental Ella after he finds her resting near a lake. Anastasia uses the magic wand to reverse time and convince Prince Charming that she was the one who he danced with at the Royal Ball. Available to stream on HBO Max In the 2004 movie Ella Enchanted, based on the novel by Gail Carson Levine, actress Anne Hathaway plays Ella a girl who is given the gift of obedience by her godmother. Cinderella, who is played by Anna Kendrick, is a strong supporting role in this tale about a childless couple who venture out to find ingredients for a spell that will reverse a witches' curse and help them receive a wish. A still more surprising fact is that the story can be traced back to a Greek historian who wrote a tale about a Greco-Egyptian Cinderella, Rhodopis, in the first century B.C.E. Many Cinderella works have since then been released with different adaptations of the story. This live-action version of Cinderella fleshes out the characters more, giving a new perspective to those characters who were previously one-note villains.
