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Live from the masters hosts

The third primetime tournament of "Jeopardy! Masters" is set to premiere on Wednesday, April 30, at 9 p.m. ET on ABC, with Ken Jennings as the host. Viewers can stream the event for free using trials from Fubo, DirecTV Stream, Hulu, and/or Hulu + Live TV. This special edition of the iconic game show features highly ranked contestants competing head-to-head for a \$500,000 grand prize, with each episode consisting of two games. The hour-long "Jeopardy! Masters" special can be watched on ABC at 9/8c, immediately following the premiere of "Celebrity Wheel of Fortune." For streaming options, various services offer free trials, including Fubo, DirecTV Stream, Hulu, and Hulu + Live TV, with prices starting at \$9.99/month for Hulu and \$82.99/month for Hulu + Live TV. Additionally, select ABC series are available on Disney+, which can be bundled with other services like ESPN+ and Max for discounted rates. CBS Sports lead announcer Andrew Catalon has taken on more responsibilities, calling both March Madness and the Masters. A recent April Fools' joke by Tiger Woods highlighted his sense of humor. Meanwhile, Max Homa and Wyndham Clark will participate in the Masters Par 3 Contest broadcast for ESPN this year. Some critics have expressed disappointment with the latest Masters promotion. Jim Nantz, who stepped down as lead NCAA Tournament announcer last year, enjoys his role documenting golfers. Former CBS Sports Chairmen Sean McManus and Eli Manning are part of a group that highlights the best sports themes. The Masters will air live coverage on both CBS and Paramount+ this weekend. A countdown recently ranked the 25 Greatest Sports Themes of All Time, with an old favorite soon to return. Tiger Woods praised his experience in golf, saying he'll "treasure" it forever. The world of sports media is abuzz with fresh developments: a new show in the works for the "Inside the NBA" crew and Mike Tirico's guest stint are making waves. The Masters' broadcast on CBS was hailed as one of its best productions in recent years, garnering significant viewership numbers. Meanwhile, Sports Media Watch delves into the latest industry news, including Andre Agassi joining forces with TNT for the French Open coverage and the Cleveland Guardians negotiating TV rights. Other stories include Bill Simmons re-signing with Spotify and a leadership shake-up at Main Street Sports. The Masters teed off with a nine-year high in viewership, surpassing previous records. Meanwhile, an NBA doubleheader dominated sports ratings on Wednesday, April 10. Caitlin Clark's performance in her final collegiate game has the potential to break new ground for women's college basketball. The NFL Network is undergoing layoffs as part of its cost-cutting measures. Fox Sports is launching a new program, and other sports news includes the NCAA men's and women's basketball tournaments reaching high audiences. The combination of Easter celebrations and an underdog upset in the NCAA tournaments delivered one of the largest basketball audiences in recent history. Predictions for upcoming college basketball games suggest a highly-viewed 48 hours ahead. NFL RedZone host Scott Hanson will be hosting a similar show for NBC's Olympics coverage, while Reggie Miller is set to extend his contract. The LIV Golf league begins its new season at El Camaleón Golf Course this week. Live NFL action dominated TV viewership on Sunday, January 14, with even a year-old encore outperforming the competition. Pro and college football followed up with another strong performance in the previous week's ratings. The final Pac-12 football game topped sports ratings for Friday, December 1. NBC will not retain lead golf analyst Paul Azinger for the upcoming season. The PGA Tour FedEx Cup maintained its position at the top of the sports ratings charts for a second consecutive week. The British Open posted its smallest final round audience in nearly a decade. Nexstar's The CW has acquired a Power 5 college football package, and fans can catch track and field's national championship on the 2023 USATF Championships schedule. The U.S. Open saw significant viewership with a West Coast location, but following the most-watched NBA Playoffs in five years and one of the least-watched NBA Finals on record, where does the league go from here? The PGA-Pf partnership will have far-reaching implications for golf on TV. Back-to-back Celtics wins narrowed the Eastern Conference Finals, while viewership remains relatively steady. The PGA Championship saw its lowest viewership in 15 years on Sunday. A strong finish for Stars-Kraken, and Warriors-Kings delivered another significant increase on Monday night. The USFL and XFL split the limited spring football audience in their first head-to-head matchup. Viewership dipped for the NBA regular season. Out-of-home viewing boosted Easter Sunday's ratings, and also contributed to the Masters reaching a five-year high. The Masters got off to a slower start than last year but had its second-best opening in recent history. Ratings predictions suggest men's and women's college basketball national championship games will be highly viewed. MLB Opening Night saw an increase in viewership on ESPN, while longtime voice of the men's NCAA Tournament Jim Nantz is stepping down from his position after this season. Rives, Jon Lewis, Al Michaels, Kirk Herbstreit The top sporting events of 2020 are seeing some impressive viewership numbers, with four major stars in sports contributing to a 16-year high on the PGA Tour. The Bundesliga's return also brought in larger-than-usual numbers, while live golf did relatively well. The NFL schedule has been released without any notable changes despite the ongoing pandemic. The PBR Tour is set to return this weekend, and ESPN will air its most acclaimed documentary next week. The Masters tournament has been postponed, but other events like the US Open saw success with Fox Sports achieving six-year highs in ratings and viewership. Meanwhile, the NBA had a reprieve from its ratings slump, and the British Open saw a four-year high in viewership. Sports TV ratings have been on the upswing due to several high-profile events. The Women's NCAA Tournament final saw significant overnight increases, while ESPN regained ground after losing the US Open and British Open rights. However, the NFL suffered a decline with its smallest opening night audience in years. Tiger Woods' victories also boosted ratings for PGA Tour and major tournaments, including the PGA Championship and British Open. Other notable events, such as Cardinals-Dodgers, Djokovic-Federer, and WNBA games, saw increased viewership. But the UEFA Champions League experienced a decline in ratings. Meanwhile, NBA playoff games and other sports events like the Kentucky Derby had mixed results. The PGA Tour ratings continue to rise with Tiger Woods' return boosting viewership. Last week's Houston Open garnered near-record numbers. Meanwhile, NASCAR Texas ratings hit an all-time low. The Masters also saw a significant surge in interest, with Sunday's final round hitting a three-year high and the tournament as a whole reaching its largest audience in three years. This comes on the heels of Tiger Woods' first Masters appearance in three years, which delivered the event's largest audience since 2019. The PGA Championship got off to a modest start, but not as strong as last year's opening round. Other sports like NBA Playoffs and Stanley Cup Playoffs are also drawing interest, with their ratings forecasts included alongside other events such as NASCAR's Brickyard 400 and Formula 1. TV ratings for The Masters golf tournament were relatively low this year, with some rounds hitting historic lows despite a dramatic finish to the competition. The absence of star player Tiger Woods was likely a factor, as well as increased competition from other sports like NASCAR and the Olympics. Golf's major tournaments, including The Masters, PGA Championship, and US Open, have seen declining ratings in recent years, which is also true for the LPGA Tour. However, some golf events, like those featuring top players Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal, were able to attract higher viewership numbers. The Olympics have had a significant impact on sports viewership, with some events receiving high ratings despite being overshadowed by other competitions within the Games.
