Instant messaging software service imoDeveloper(s)Pagebites, Inc.Initial releaseApril 2007; 18 years ago (2007-04)Operating systemCross-platformTypeInstant messagingLicenseProprietaryWebsiteimo.im imo is a proprietary audio/video calling and instant messaging software service.[1][2] It allows sending music, video, PDFs and other files, along with various free stickers.[3][4] It supports encrypted group video and voice calls with up to 20 participants.[5][6] According to its developer, the service possesses over 200 million users[1] and over 50 million messages per day are sent through it.[2] The product was created as a web-based application in 2005 for accessing multiple chat platforms,[7] including Facebook Messenger, Google Talk, Yahoo!
