California-born Virginia Giuffre, a victim of convicted sex offender Jeffrey Epstein, said little in the years since she settled a civil lawsuit with Prince Andrew. While Andrew, a friend of Epstein, rejected any wrongdoing and continues to deny claims he sexually assaulted her when she was 17, the settlement he paid her was reportedly around 12m. In a joint statement with Giuffre released at the time, he said he regretted his association with Epstein and commended the bravery of Giuffre and other survivors in standing up for themselves and others.Yet three years on from the settlement, Giuffre was back in the headlines last month after the mother of three, aged 41, posted a distressing image to Instagram showing her bruised and battered face, saying she had just four days to live after going into renal failure following a car crash.Writing about the crash, Giuffre said: This year has been the worst start to a new year. I won't bore anyone with the details, but I think it important to note that when a school bus driver comes at you driving 110km as we were slowing for a turn that no matter what your car is made of it might as well be a tin can. I've gone into kidney renal failure, they've given me four days to live, transferring me to a specialist hospital in uremoly. Im ready to go, just not until I see my babies one last time, but you know what they say about wishes. Days after the post on 30 March, via a family spokesperson, she said that the picture and caption had been mistakenly posted to her public Instagram and were only meant to be on her private Facebook page. Earlier today, her family revealed that she had died by suicide. It is with utterly broken hearts that we announce that Virginia passed away last night at her farm in Western Australia, Giuffres family said in a statement. She lost her life to suicide, after being a lifelong victim of sexual abuse and sex trafficking.Five years since Andrews disastrous and somewhat bizarre interview with Emily Maitlis, a worrying picture of his accuser was emerging. As the crash story made headlines around the world, Ross Munnns, the school bus driver involved in the collision, disputed her account of the incident, saying she had blown [it] out of proportion and referring to the incident as a minor collision. West Australian police also confirmed that there were no reported injuries following the incident, which occurred in Neeragabby, 20km north of Perth.Details also emerged that Giuffre had recently become estranged from Robert, her husband of 22 years. A Western Australia courts spokesperson also confirmed that she had been charged with breaching a family violence restraining order for an alleged incident that took place in Ocean Reef, near Perth, on 2 February. The then-19-year-old Virginia Roberts met Robert Giuffre, a martial arts expert, in Thailand in 2002, after Epstein paid for her to fly to Asia to do a massage course. They married 10 days after meeting, and, after a few peripatetic years, chose the sleepy Ocean Reef suburb as their home in December 2020. In December 2023, under photographs of the pair cuddling, she wrote: Twenty-one years ago this amazing man rescued me from Epstein [and] Maxwells clutches. I thank God every day for putting this beautiful man in my life!The image Giuffre projected was of living in this beach enclave, looking after her pets, doing yoga and baking cakes a lifestyle which once saw her dubbed the Duchess of Ocean Reef. Few, then, would recognise the picture of domestic distress that was slowly coming to light. Giuffre claimed the picture showing her bruised face was only meant for her private Facebook (Virginia Giuffre/Instagram)More than two decades after she was preyed upon by Epstein and Maxwell, who hired her when she was working as a locker-room attendant at Donald Trumps Mar-a-Lago resort, Giuffre had become a polarising figure. For some she was a cause celebre for sexual assault victims, while others claimed she was always a troubled fantasist.Even before last months bizarre events, commenters were writing on her Instagram post, claiming she had lied. This sentiment was echoed by Lady Victoria Hervey, who briefly dated Andrew in 1999, when she waded into the saga on social media.The photo of a young Giuffre (then Virginia Roberts) with Maxwell and Prince Andrew, both of whom have claimed the image is fake (PAKARMA, wrote the 48-year-old over Giuffres hospital selfie, adding Europes 1986 glom rock smash The Final Countdown as background music. She then went on to call Giuffre the queen of the fake photo and accused her of inventing her accusations, as well as her injuries. She claimed to have heard from reliable sources that the FBI was preparing to arrest Giuffre, and that it was almost time to celebrate her downfall.Giuffre was strolling in a beachside market when she received the call from her lawyer in July 2019 that confirmed Epstein had finally been charged with sex crimes in New York. As Giuffre explained in a rare interview in December 2021, she chose to first tell her story publicly in 2011 after the birth of her daughter a year earlier. Giuffre, who also has two teenage sons, told The Cut: I don't want my little girl growing up in a world that is so vicious.Concerns were voiced about Giuffres mental health after the posts (@virginiarobertsrisin11/Instagram)She went on to set up a charity, Speak Out, Act, Reclaim (SOAR), to which Prince Andrew made a donation. Many credited her bravery for helping them to come forward about their own stories of abuse and for creating a supportive network of fellow victims. However, the speculation around the veracity of her claims never fully went away. Indeed, the unsealing of a cache of documents last year included a 2016 deposition in which she contradicted an earlier report that she had once flown to Epsteins private island with former US president Bill Clinton.Although Giuffre was quoted in a Daily Mail article in 2011 saying she had met Clinton twice and had flown to the Caribbean with him in a helicopter when she was 17, in the deposition she says she was never in a helicopter with Clinton and that her conversation with the Mail journalist was taken out of context.Giuffre received a reported 12m from Andrew in an out-of-court settlement (US District Court)The documents were originally filed as part of a defamation lawsuit brought in 2015 by Giuffre against Ghislaine Maxwell, who was found guilty of helping Epstein sexually abuse young girls and sentenced to 20 years in prison in June 2022. While legal experts acknowledge that victims of abuse and trauma can get dates and details wrong in testimony, multiple media investigations have disputed claims Giuffre has made dating back to her childhood. However, the fact remains that Epstein was facing trial at the time of his death and Maxwell has been convicted for her crimes.However, the headlines about the crash painted a more confusing and worrying picture of how Giuffres life was unravelling. In Australia, 9News Perth reported that Giuffre admitted herself to Joondalup Health Campus in Perth with a pre-existing injury immediately after the car collision. She was discharged the following day. We were then told that she was taken to Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital by ambulance and was seeking treatment for pain. Its understood she was discharged shortly afterwards. Another television outlet, 7News, reported that Giuffres heavy bruising was the result of a fall. The 71-year-old who was driving the vehicle in which Giuffre was travelling at the time of the crash is also reported to be a carer, adding to the mystery of Giuffres mental and physical condition.Whether Giuffre was deeply troubled after the breakdown of her marriage or continued to suffer as a result of the abuse she endured in her youth, her death will then doubtless raise more questions about one of the murkiest episodes to envelop a royal family. On March 28, 1941, shortly after the devastating dawn of WWII, Virginia Woolf (January 25, 1882March 28, 1941) filled her overcoat pockets with rocks and walked in the River Ouse behind her house never to emerge alive. A relapse of the all-consuming depression she had narrowly escaped in her youth had finally claimed her life. She left behind a remarkable body of work from her poignant diaries to her magnificent essays to her little-known childrens books to the longest and most charming love letter in literature and a cohort of heartbroken friends, but the most stirring thing she left behind was her suicide letter to her husband Leonard:Dearest,I feel certain I am going mad again. I feel we cant go through another of those terrible times. And I shant recover this time. I begin to hear voices, and I cant concentrate. So I am doing what seems the best thing to do. You have given me the greatest possible happiness. You have been in every way all that anyone could be. I dont think two people could have been happier till this terrible disease came. I cant fight any longer. I know that I am spoiling your life, that without me you could work. And you will I know. You see I cant even write this properly. I cant read. What I want to say is I owe all the happiness of my life to you. You have been entirely patient with me and incredibly good. I want to say that everybody knows it. If anybody could have saved me it would have been you. Everything has gone from me but the certainty of your goodness. I cant go on spoiling your life any longer.I dont think two people could have been happier than we have been.What made the letter especially heartbreaking, however, wasnt just that it embodied so excruciatingly modernitys tragic epidemic but also that its fate reflected the ugliest aspects of media and journalism. In
afterwards: Letters on the Death of Virginia Woolf (public library), scholar Sybil Oldfield notes that after Woolfs letter was made public, members of the British press took it upon themselves to bestow upon the beloved author a last judgment a painfully ungenerous one. On April 27, a month after Woolfs death, The Sunday Times ran the following self-righteous evisceration by a Mrs. Kathleen Hicks, wife of the Bishop of Lincoln:Sir, I read in your issue of Sunday last that the misation at several days later the version of the story of the death of Woolf was published. The incident is particularly unsettling for two reasons. At its root is a testament to what a cruel and indeterminate predator depression is, capable of consuming even humanitys greatest minds, yet the uncompassionate response illustrates just how poorly we understand the condition. Above all, however, embedded in the medias treatment of Virginias suicide is a grotesque reminder that the only thing more morally repugnant than passing judgment on another human beingn private struggle and inner world than choosing self-righteousness over compassionate understanding is doing so publicly, especially as a currency of tabloidism. What a spectacular failing of the awareness that its far more rewarding to understand than to be right. Ms Giuffre, who was trafficked by Jeffrey Epsteinas a teenager, took her own life at her farmhouse in Neeragabby on Friday night.She was one of the most prominent accusers of convicted sex offenders Epstein and his former girlfriend Ghislaine Maxwell, who she said kept her as a sex slave while flying her around the world and offering to their powerful associates 'like a platter of fruit'.She alleged they trafficked her to the Duke of York when she was 17 and was three times sexually assaulted by him - a claim which Prince Andrew has denied. The prince reached an out-of-court settlement with her in 2022.A WA Police Force spokesperson told Daily Mail Australia preliminary findings indicated the death was 'not suspicious' and that paramedics had provided 'emergency first aid' shortly after arriving at the home. About 9.50pm Friday 25 April, emergency services received a report a woman had been located unresponsive at a residence in Neeragabby, 'the said. 'Police and St John WA attended and provided emergency first-aid. Sadly, the 41-year-old woman was declared deceased at the scene. The death is being investigated by Major Crime detectives; early indication is the death is not suspicious. She filed a federal lawsuit against Andrew in 2021 which he agreed to settle for an undisclosed fee in 2022. He has consistently denied ever having sex with her. The family acquaintances arrived in a Ute believed to belong to Virginia Giuffre's husband Robert, who she split from earlier this year. He was not one of the passengers. A woman, wearing a dark-coloured hoodie, got out of the passenger seat. The driver carried cake boxes into the family home, followed by a young woman. The girl held only her phone in one hand as she made her way inside. She had alleged she had sex with Andrew three times, in London during a 2001 trip, at Epstein's New York mansion when she was 17 and in the Virgin Islands at age 18. Andrew repeatedly denied her allegations and has said he cant recall ever meeting her, although a photograph of them together in a London townhouse, his arm around her bare midriff, was included in Giuffre's lawsuit against him.Epstein killed himself while awaiting trial on federal sex trafficking charges involving dozens of teenage girls and young women, some as young as 14.In lawsuits, Ms Giuffre said she was a teenage spa attendant at Mar-a-Lago, President Donald Trump's Palm Beach club, when she was approached in 2000 by Epstein's girlfriend and later employee, Maxwell. Ms Giuffre said Maxwell hired her as a masseuse for Epstein, but the couple effectively made her a sexual servant, pressuring her into gratifying not only Epstein but his friends and associates.Originally born in Florida, Ms Giuffre had moved to Australia with her husband Robert in 2019 prior to Epstein being arrested. The couple share three children. She said her car had been hit by a school bus travelling at over 60mph and the accident had left her with kidney failure.The photograph showed discolouration to Ms Giuffre's face and chest which has been described as severe bruising. Sources close to the family claim that ongoing marital tensions with her husband led to a temporary custody arrangement where Giuffres access to her 14 children became restricted. Although specific legal details have not been fully disclosed to the public, friends reported that she felt increasingly isolated and powerless, describing the situation as one of the deepest emotional blows she had ever endured. Being cut off from her children reportedly worsened her mental health struggles and contributed to her sense of despair.Prince Andrew Accuser Virginia Giuffre SuicideGiuffre, who for years fought for justice against some of the most powerful men in the world, was reportedly battling deep personal struggles before her death.Behind closed doors, Giuffre was said to be grappling with heartbreaking personal issues. Sources close to the family revealed that she and her husband were facing serious marital problems. Allegedly, there were periods when she was not allowed to see her children freely, due to escalating tensions at home. Those closest to her say this separation from her kids deeply affected her mental health, creating a sense of isolation and hopelessness that grew worse in her final years.Virginia Giuffre Car Accident Prior To DeathJust weeks before her passing, Giuffre was involved in a minor bus accident that attracted media attention. According to reports, a city transit bus clipped her parked car. While the incident was initially alarming to those close to her, the bus driver later stated it was a minor accident with no major injuries or damage. However, at the time Virginia had posted that she sustained severe injuries and only had 4 days to live. She later retracted that statement and said the post of her bruised face and statement was only intended for friends and family.Jeffrey Epstein Accuser Virginia Giuffre SuicideFor years, Giuffre lived under the harsh glare of public scrutiny. As one of the most prominent voices
against Jeffrey Epstein and his network, including Prince Andrew, she faced online harassment, relentless media coverage, and threats. Even as she fought bravely for survivors of exploitation, the psychological toll of constantly reliving her trauma publicly cannot be understated.conspiracy theories, particularly given her ties to some of the worlds most powerful and controversial figures.
