Go to Student Score Reports and sign in with the username and password associated with your College Board account.Watch the video below to understand your score report if you took the SAT on a weekend. The first thing youll see is your total score, which is a combination of your scores on the Reading and Writing and Math sections.Next, you can understand your Total and Section scores in context by seeing how your scores compare to the average scores of other test takers. Depending on where you live, this might include other students in your school, district, state, country, or other students worldwide that took the SAT.Percentile comparisons help you to understand the percentage of students scoring the same as, or lower than, you in these groups. For example, 57th percentile means that your score was the same as, or higher than, 57% of the other students in the comparison group.In the Knowledge and Skills section, learn more about your strengths and areas you can focus on improving. This section shows your performance in the four Reading and Writing and four Math content areas and what percentage of the section each content area represents. The performance score band comes from our Skills Insight Tool, where you can view skills students at your level are typically able to demonstrate and sample questions that are typically answered correctly. If you want to improve your score, you can view skills and example questions in the next score band, with answer explanations included.Now that you know how you did and what skills you need to work on, you can take your skills to the next level using free Official Digital SAT Prep on Khan Academy to improve your score. Self-reporting your SAT/ACT scores when you apply to college is a great way to send your test scores to schools. Its free, its easy, and it doesnt take very long. This guide will walk you through the self-reporting process step-by-step. Follow each of these steps in order, and youll be good to go. Lets get started. Step 1: Make sure the schools youre applying to allow you to self-report your scores It may seem like a no-brainer, but before you get ready to self-report your scores, make sure the schools youre planning to apply to accept self-reported scores to begin with. The good news is that many schools do allow self-reported schools. Schools that use the Common Application (like we do here at Chapman) tend to allow you to self-report because the Common App now has a dedicated self-reporting section. Step 2:Save your scores as a PDF or screenshot The next step is to download aPDF of your SAT scores from your College Board account or take ascreenshot of your ACT scores from your ACT account (since ACT no longer provides downloadable PDFs). Why do you need to do this? Simple: many schools ask you to submit your scores by attaching a score report PDF/screenshot to your application. Not all schools ask for this however. Some schools may let you self-report your scores manually by typing them in instead of providing a PDF/screenshot. So you may not end up needing the PDF(s) or screenshot(s) for all your applications. But we recommend getting them beforehand anyway, just in case they are needed in a particular application. Follow the steps below to get your SAT/ACT scores in PDF/screenshot form. To get a PDF of your SAT scores: Log in to your College Board account. Navigate to the score report you want. Download your PDF by choosing Download Your Score Report. The score report will automatically include your name and test date, so you can safely upload this to any college application that requires it. (Here is an SAT score report sample from College Board. Your SAT score report should look like this.) To get a screenshot of your ACT scores: Log in to your ACT account. Navigate to the test you want to report. Choose View Scores. Screenshot the page of your actual scores, not the superscores.Your score report must include your name, the date of the exam, and all test scores. Step 3: Apply away Now that you have your score report PDF(s) or screenshot(s), you're ready to self-report. Navigate to the application of whichever school(s) youre looking to apply to, and get started. Self-reporting is as easy as uploading the PDFs/screenshots you already have on hand, or entering your scores manually. Your score is calculated by doubling your Reading and Writing Score, adding it to your Math score, then dividing that sum by 10. After reviewing your Selection Index score on page 1 of your score report PDF, you can go to page 2 to read more information about your eligibility for the National Merit Scholarship Program and how scholarship recipients are determined by NMSC.
