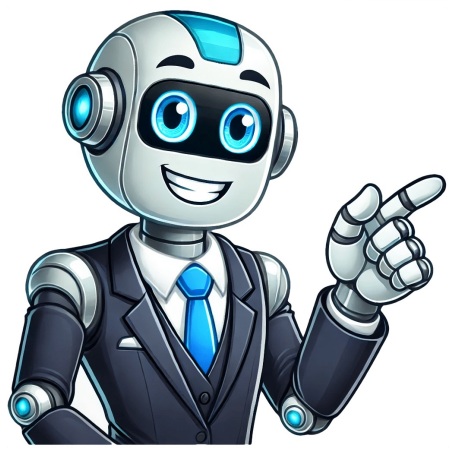

Perhaps. In the USA we go on trips, on vacations, and on interviews. I think it is fairly standard. I have no problem repeating the same word if that word is the best word for that situation. (Note my use of the word "word".) So there's no difference in meaning between : "in an interview" and "on an interview" ??? It seems to depend on your audience. "On an interview" appears to be the American English option. "On the interview" is the entire process (the trip to the place where the interview takes place, etc). "To go swimming" doesn't mean you immediately start swimming where you are. Likewise, "to go on an interview" doesn't mean you immediately start answering questions. "In the interview" is what happens while you speaking to the interviewer. Canadian English differs from AmE on this one, then: I would go to an interview, or for an interview, but never on an interview. And I would worry about things that one must never do in or during an interview. British English (at least mine) is the same as theartichoke's Canadian English in this respect. [...] In the USA we go on trips, on vacations, and on interviews. [...] In the UK we go on trips and on holiday(s) ... but not on interviews. I'd say that's because once I'm there, I might call someone and say "I'm on a trip", or "I'm on holiday" ... but not "I'm on an interview". For me, "on" goes with a temporary change of general situation. When I go on a trip or on holiday, that's a broad 'framework' within which I do other things. Whereas an interview is more like a meeting, and I wouldn't say "I'm going on a meeting". It would be "I'm going to a meeting" or "I'm going to London for a meeting". Similarly, then, for an interview. Tomorrow I'm going for a haircut. It involves a trip across across town to where it takes place, etc (cf Myrdon's #7), but I wouldn't call the entire process "going on a haircut". Similarly for an interview.
