Begin looking for an item that can prevent the mower from receiving one of these items. Check for a plugged air filter, dirty carburetor, restriction in the fuel components, dirty spark plug, or old fuel. These are the easiest items to check. Next, if you rule out fuel and air being a problem, you will need to find an electrical issue that will keep your mower from getting the spark required for burn combustion in the cylinder. In addition to the spark plug, you'll want to check out the ignition coil, battery, terminals, and charging system. In addition to the items mentioned above, your Ariens may shut down when it overheats. This can happen when the cooling fins are broken or plugged; the engine shroud is dirty, and the heat shield is not securely in place. This prevents air from circulating around the cylinder head and engine block to keep it cool. A plugged air filter, insufficient engine oil level, or wrong grade of engine oil can also cause the Ariens mower to overheat. Other items to check that can cause your mower to die are insufficient fuel, wrong choke setting, bad gas cap, clogged mower deck, and faulty ignition coil. If you catch the problem early, you may be able to fix it before it causes significant damage. This includes items like a clogged filter, a bad engine gasket, too much engine oil, or spilled oil from a recent oil change. When your Ariens mower begins to smoke because there isn't enough engine oil in the crankcase, you have a more significant problem where extensive engine damage may have occurred.
