The Berklee Admissions Committee is keenly interested in your application, so it's essential to make a strong impression from the outset. Once you've been accepted, you'll have the opportunity to showcase your talents through performances and interviews. We wish you the best of luck in this process. To navigate our campus, please follow these instructions: Click the button in the upper right-hand corner to enter full screen mode. Use the arrow keys on your keyboard to move around the space and click your mouse to interact with objects. The campus is divided into two floors. To switch between them, simply click on the numbers 1 or 2 located in the upper left-hand corner of the screen. This area of the campus features a range of facilities, including large technology labs, a scoring stage, studios, a library, and several other amenities. Larger instrument lockers have priority given to contemporary performance students at Berklee's Valencia campus. Students can reserve various rooms, including practice spaces, scoring studio, recording rooms, ensemble areas, and classrooms using their account on the intranet system. Each room has specific rules regarding usage, time limits, and access privileges. The Music Technology Complex was designed by Walters-Storyk Design Group with two tech labs and five recording studios. The complex includes a world-class scoring stage, designed in collaboration with Berklee staff and consultants from Walters-Storyk. This facility is comparable to those created for renowned artists like Alicia Keys, Bob Marley, Bruce Springsteen, Celine Dion, Jay-Z, and Jazz at Lincoln Center. The technology complex prepares students to meet the demands of the music industry by offering a wide range of equipment and tools. The scoring stage is a 126 square meter facility with an Avid S6 Control Surface for immersive mixing workflows and a Surround 7.1 system. It features various Microphone Preamps, DAWs (Digital Audio Workstations), Outboards, Controller units, keyboards, and a Yamaha Disclavier Grand Piano. The live room is an 80 square meter area with high ceilings and variable floor surfaces to accommodate diverse acoustic configurations. The control room is designed for learning purposes and includes iso-overdub booths. Four recording studios provide students with professional production facilities equipped with the latest hardware and software. Each recording studio has excellent acoustics, sound isolation, and a size range of 12.5 square meters (135 square feet) to 18.5 square meters (200 square feet). Studio A features state-of-the-art Dolby Atmos 7.1.4 immersive audio setup for unparalleled audio experiences. Two technology labs serve as classrooms for music and global entertainment/music business courses, providing hands-on access to professional equipment and software. The tools and resources in the tech labs, combined with students' own laptops, enable them to advance their skills and complete challenging coursework. The facilities feature professional DAWs that mirror real-world studios, allowing students to meet industry demands. The Berklee College of Music Valencia campus offers state-of-the-art facilities to support the development of music business professionals. The library is a hub for learning, featuring a beautiful atmosphere and an extensive collection of materials that can be accessed through the online catalog. Students can also enjoy performances at the Palau de les Arts opera house, which has become one of the most visited attractions in Valencia. The 400-seat theater features advanced stage technology equipment and hosts various events, including concerts and film premieres. The campus includes a residence hall with 173 rooms, practice rooms, common areas, a fitness center, and a performance space that doubles as a dining hall. A music production complex with 10 studios is also available, providing students with opportunities for hands-on learning. The building itself offers an impressive 155,000 square feet of space, increasing Berklee's presence in Valencia by 23%. The facility will feature a fitness center and rooftop terrace exclusively for residents and students. The space includes 14,000 square feet dedicated to music technology, as well as 4,200 square feet of retail area on the ground floor. The building is expected to achieve LEED silver certification due to its design by William Rawn Associates.
