You must switch on your headlight when you can only see objects less than 150 meters away from you.When turning right, yield to oncoming vehicles at an intersection. When moving towards a bridge, you cannot stop at a distance closer than 5 meters to the bridge. At traffic circles, yield to vehicles already there whenever driving around one.Do not overtake a vehicle when visibility is less than 150 meters, at the top of a hill, or close to a curve. Your hooter must have a consistent pitch. If your license is a learner's license, a person with a valid drivers license must be in the vehicle with you.A vehicle license is valid for a year only. When two vehicles are being towed, their distance should not exceed 3.5 meters. Overtaking Prohibited: If you see a sign with two cars side-by-side and a line drawn through it, this means that overtaking is prohibited in those zones.U-Turn Prohibited: An upside-down U with an arrow at the end and a line drawn through it means that making a U-Turn is not allowed. These signs may refer to a lane or a parking spot and show that the space is allocated for a specific vehicle or driver.
